

Árpád Tóth (PhD 2003) is professor at the Historical Institute of the University of Miskolc since 2012 where he has lectured for 20 years. Besides, he has been part-time lecturer at Eötvös Loránd University in Budapest and Károli Gáspár University of the Reformed Church for several years and is a recurrent Erasmus guest-professor at the universities of Targu Mures (Romania) and Banská Bystrica (Slovakia). He has been the recipient of the Péter Hanák Prize (for young historians) awarded by the Historical Institute of HAS (2006) for his first monograph on the social history of the early voluntary societies of Pest. His second monograph (2009) deals with the social strategies of the burgher families of Pressburg (now: Bratislava in Slovakia) between 1780-1848. His publications include 49 articles (in German and English as well) and contributions in periodicals and anthologies, with a few published in peer-reviewed journals. He was the chief researcher of three social and urban historical projects financed by the Hungarian Research Fund (OTKA). He served as the secretary of the Hungarian Society of Social History (Hajnal István Kör – Társadalomtörténeti Egyesület) between 2004-2010 and currently is a member of its board. His major research field comprises the social history of the urban societies of Hungary in the period of the transformation from estate society to modernity (cca. 1750-1850). He has recently focused on the workings of the social network of the German Lutheran burghers throughout the Kingdom of Hungary in this period. As a member of the Lendület Integrating Families Research Group, he analyses the family relations within the Lutheran burgher communities of Pressburg and Eperjes (now: Presov in Slovakia) between 1720-1870.
