

Áron Tótság, a historian-museologist at the Körösvidék Museum in Oradea, is a doctoral candidate in the Doctoral Program in Social and Economic History of Eötvös Loránd University. He used his professional experience as a teacher (2012-2013) and later as a young researcher at the Déri Museum in Debrecen (2013-2014) and the Minority Research Institute of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences (2015-2016). He has been an independent researcher under the New National Excellence Program (2016-2018) and the Nation's Young Talent Scholarship (2018-2019). But the membership of the Collegium Talentum (2013-2016) was also decisive for him. His field of research focuses on two main areas: on the one hand, he researches the urban history of Transylvania, and on the other hand, he conducts a historical-demographic, family and household study of the region. He is writing his doctoral dissertation on the social history of urban prostitution. He contributes to the „Lendület” research group on family history through the exploration of the family and household structure of Marosvásárhely (Târgu Mureş) on the basis of the 1869 census and its family history database. He is one of the founding editors of the *Erdélyi Krónika* (Transylvanian Chronicle - www.erdelyikronika.ro), a historical portal. Since 2018, he has been a member of the editorial board of the online historical journal *Új Nézőpont* (New Perspective) of the University of Debrecen and the Hajdú-Bihar County and Debrecen Homeland Studies Association. His first monograph title is: *Egy szilágysági képes történet. Társadalom, kultúra és gazdaság Kémeren a 18-20. században*. He is the editor of three study volumes and the author of several studies.
