

**Molnár Ágnes (2003)** currently senior lecturer and full-time prelector since 2000 at the Department of Cultural and Visual Anthropology of the University of Miskolc. Former student of ethnography and cultural anthropology at Eötvös Loránd University, was a member of the Atelier Franco-Hongrois as well, which allowed her to study at École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales in Paris. There she also could get acquainted with the current trends in economic history, social history and *microstoria*. In her PhD dissertation, published in 2019, she tried to combine all this experiences in order to make the most thorough analysis possible of the social-economic changes of Kiskanizsa, a village quarter administratively belonging to Nagykanizsa, a Southwest Transdanubian market-town. The primary aim of the research was to show how family and household structure, gender-family roles, relationships between individual family members have changed as a result of the socio-economic-political environment. Her study is thus related to the work of the research group primarily through the study of the life of small farming families. She seeks to make up for the lack of written sources that characterize this social stratum with the help of oral sources in order to draw a one hundred and fifty years long trend of transition from the second half of the 19th century to the present day.
