

Zsófia V. László (PhD 2012) archivist of the Budapest City Archives, historian. In her doctoral thesis she examined the changing roles of women in the 18–19th centuries on the grounds of the funeral sermons which were very popular Hungarian language prints in Transylvania. László compared these texts of norms to familial correspondences and memories. The synthesis of her research was published in 2020 in the monography *Exemplary women. The changing roles of women in the light of funeral sermons (1711–1825)*. In the research team, she studies the family life of noble and aristocratic families in the 18th century and the position, possibilities and strategies of women within it. The other area of her research is the history of the Hungarian capital and its inhabitants in the 18–20th centuries.
