Péter Őri historian (PhD 2004) is currently a participant researcher in MTA BTK Lendület Integrating Families Research Group (2017-2022), in which he is responsible for harmonizing urban and rural demographic databases and rural database building from parish registers (18– 19th centuries). He is a senior research fellow at Hungarian Demographic Research Insitute (HDRI). His research field is historical demography, deals with Hungary's 18–19th and early 20th century population history. Within this, he concentrates on fertility behaviour and marriage customs and household formation rules, and the long term changes of these phenomena. He is also interested in the history of population censuses and other sort of historical sources upon which demographic analysis can be based. He is the editor-in-chief of journal Demográfia, which is the most important forum of demographic science in Hungary. He is the secretary of the Demographic Committee at Hungarian Academy of Sciences, and the member of the scientific board of European Society of Historical Demography. Besides, he has participated in peer-reviewed international conferences on demography and social history (European Population Conference: 2010, 2012, 2014; European Social Science History Conference: 2006, 2010, 2012, 2014, 2016; Social Science History Association (USA) Conference: 2011, 2016) for more than ten years. He took part in international research programmes related to historical demography like MOSAIC Project and EHPS-Net (European Historical Population Sample-Network). In Hungary he lead research programmes: Demographic development and the spatial differences in demographic behaviour in 18–20<sup>th</sup> century Hungary (Hungarian Research Fund - OTKA, 2008–2011) and Fertility transition from micro-perspective in 19–20th century Hungary (Hungarian Research Fund - OTKA, 2014–). His list of publications contains a monograph (in Hungarian) and numerous edited volumes and articles in Hungarian journals and peer-reviewed international journals (*History of the Family*, Demográfia, English Edition).
